RESPONSE: 5 Fire Engines, 2 Trucks, 2 Battalion Chiefs, 1 Breathing Support, 1 Shift Training Captain, 1 Fire Investigator ASSISTING AGENCIES: East Contra Costa Fire, Con Fire EMS, Antioch PD, Red Cross, PG&E TOTAL FIRE PERSONNEL AT SCENE: 28 All Concerned, Contra Costa County Firefighters responded to a report of a residential structure fire early last night at 410 Lynn Ave in Antioch. Upon arrival Engine 82 (Antioch) reported smoke showing from the attic of a two story house. The fire was burning on the second floor in the attic space. Engine 82 could not confirm if a disabled elderly women was still inside the home. Crews quickly placed hose lines inside the home and performed primary searches to ensure all victims were removed. At the same time crews coordinated cutting holes into the roof for ventilation. This fire was extinguished because of a well coordinated attack by all firefighters on scene. Searches for civilians were all clear. Seven adults, two children and one dog escaped out of the home with no injuries. During the fire the PG&E service drop to the home failed. The energized electrical line dropped onto one of our Fire Trucks. It caused 3 small burn marks on top of the Truck. No firefighters were injured. PG&E was called to the scene to secure the hazard.

Antioch PD assisted with traffic control.

Our fire investigation unit determined that the fire started in the attic space due to an electrical issue.

Red Cross was called to the scene to assist 7 adults, 2 children and one dog.
