RESPONSE: 2nd Alarm Wildland with Additional Alarm structure protection.

ASSISTING AGENCIES: Brentwood PD, AMR, PGE, RedCross

TOTAL FIRE PERSONNEL AT SCENE: 72

On the afternoon of June 19, 2025, Contra Costa Fire received multiple calls reporting a fast-moving vegetation fire near Lone Tree Way and Sunrise Drive in Brentwood. The fire was rapidly spreading and threatening nearby residential structures, prompting an immediate structure response in addition to the initial vegetation fire dispatch.

Upon arrival, first units confirmed that the fire had extended into multiple structures. Several homes were actively threatened by advancing flames, with smoke and heat visibly impacting neighboring properties. More resources for structure fire and vegetation fire were requested due to the escalating conditions.

Given the complexity and expanding scope of the incident, the fireground was organized into the operational expanded incident command system. This allowed for effective management of structure protection, vegetation fire suppression, exposure control and air support. Copter 1, conducted multiple water drops to assist with containment efforts and provide situational awareness of the entirety of the incident.

Firefighters faced challenging conditions as the fire quickly spread across dry fuels and into multiple homes and outbuildings. The first-arriving engine companies, staffed with four firefighters (one more than typical three-person crews), were able to immediately and simultaneously engage in structure protection, fire attack, and tactical support. This additional staffing contributed significantly to an effective initial response. Ultimately, no primary homes were lost, all civilians were accounted for, and multiple fires were brought under control.

Damage and Outcome:

- 2 residential homes sustained fire damage.
- 2 accessory dwelling units sustained heavy damage.
- 5 sheds and kennels sustained heavy damage.
- 6 adult residents were displaced by the fire.
- 1 individual was transported with minor injuries while evacuating.

Through coordinated ground and air operations, the fire damage was minimized. Crews remained on scene into the evening to complete fire overhaul and damage assessment.

The cause of the fire is currently under investigation.
